Nebraska will be staid. That is, they will stop temporarily until the matter is decided in the second state, so that the employer isn't burdened by the necessity of proceeding with two litigations at once in two different places on the same claim. And then the third thing that the bill does is to indicate that to the extent that you may have been paid benefits on that same claim in another state, if in Nebraska then you are also paid benefits, the Nebraska payment...the Nebraska employer gets a credit, so that you're not paid twice. They get a credit to the extent that you were paid in another state. So I want to reemphasize that this doesn't take any worker's right away to file in Nebraska. Any Nebraska worker can still file in Nebraska at any time. All it purports to do is to try to straighten out the jurisdictional...some of the jurisdictional questions that relate to workers' comp, that don't relate to most other areas of the law, but because of res judicata, because of the judicial doctrine. But in the area of workers' comp, the courts have said that there need to be statutes in this area. And so that's what we're trying to do, is to develop statutes that define which court you go to and how you proceed and how you do it in such a way that you make your claim once, and you hear it through the process, and that's it. That's the whole purpose of the bill. And I appreciate your consideration of it. Thank you.

**SPEAKER BROMM:** Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Preister, followed by Senator Connealy.

**SENATOR PREISTER:** Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. Mr. President, I would ask for a ruling of the germaneness of the amendment.

**SPEAKER BROMM:** Give me a moment, Senator Preister. Senator Beutler, the Chair would certainly offer you an opportunity to offer your explanation with respect to germaneness. And I would offer Senator Preister that opportunity after yourself.

**SENATOR BEUTLER:** Senator, the amendment that I'm offering doesn't have a particular section number to go with it. But it is, obviously, a workers' comp issue. These sections of statutes that are in LB 332, that are in the original bill, are
