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states that are not contained in the laws of Nebraska. Rather than try to give those outside this state and those inside this state who are very nervous of temperament and timid of disposition the idea that any person they see may pose such a threat that the only way to feel safe and be safe is to carry a concealed deadly weapon, the Legislature would do much better by trying to make of this society a kinder gentler place. Guns do not gentle down anybody. Guns create an attitude of aggression, in many people who are the least capable of dealing with such a weapon. I have mentioned before how if a person is unarmed and walking down the street and sees an individual or some individuals who may bring a touch of fear into that person's heart, the person will cross the street or go a different direction. If you give that person a gun, not only will the person with the gun not go a different direction but will carry...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...himself or herself in a challenging manner hoping that the opportunity will present itself to shoot somebody. These types of things occur right now. And supposedly law-abiding persons are the perpetrators. And that shooting is the first violation of the law he or she had committed. People in Nebraska are not menaced. Most people not only will never be the victim of a crime, they will never witness a crime. They will never know anybody who was the victim of a crime. If we deal with the reality in this state, this bill will be put to rest. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Price, on the motion to recommit to committee.

SENATOR PRICE: Senator Cudaback and members of the body, standing in solid, unwavering opposition to this legislation, I will yield my time to Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, you have almost five minutes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Price. Thank you,
