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us, the senators. So I'm probably taking out my irritation at some of your past actions, but I think this letter is irresponsible and I think that the Legislature ought to say so to you, and that is what I am doing this morning. Thank you very much, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Senator Preister.

SENATOR PREISTER: Thank you, Mr. President. I would yield my time to Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, you have almost five minutes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. Thank you, Senator Preister. And, as I said, I'm accepting time from anybody who will give it to me. I appreciate it. And I am trying to build a record here. I'm discussing the bill itself, problems with the bill, and I'm looking at Senator Aguilar. I don't know if he's thinking deeply about this, but I was shocked when I saw his name as...on this bill, but you never know what people are thinking until they declare themselves. But you know, I should not be unfair to Senator Aguilar. I mentioned his name, but for the record, so that everybody is treated similarly, Senator Aguilar, the names of those on this bill are Tyson, Aguilar, Baker, Byars, Combs, Cudaback, Cunningham, Engel, Erdman, Hudkins, Janssen, Jensen, Jones, McDonald...McDonald?...oh, my heart!...McDonald, Mossey, Dwite Pedersen, Don Pederson, Quandahl, Redfield, Schrock, Smith, Stuhr, Synowiecki, Vrtiska, and Wehrbein. Those that the names on this bill. I hadn't read through all of them before now. I am stunned, but not into silence. I think some people signed onto this as a favor to Senator Tyson, probably with the expectation that the bill would go nowhere. But we're approaching a moment of decision and some of the people who are on this bill probably are not even here. They had 25 names on this bill. It takes 33 to get cloture. The record, I think, is replete with reasons and arguments as to why such a bill as this should not go into the statute books.
