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there, there was 1 building that is being used for patients, 1 out 31 buildings. I think that we can do better. That was the reason for introduction of the bill. I think that we can provide better services for the consumers. Also, we have this Olmstead decision that was a Supreme Court decision that said if individuals want to be treated closer to their home you must provide that, you the state must provide that.

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR JENSEN: What I'm proposing certainly is not a new idea. Governor Warner in Virginia has come up with a similar system. The letter that we passed out to you which...or not the letter but the editorial that was in yesterday's World-Herald, lessons for Nebraska, shows what Alabama has done, and there is a move to do this. Now certainly we're not taking advantage in this state of our Medicaid dollars where we could get, in community-based services, a 60 percent match, rather than putting all of our General Fund dollars into the operation of these three regional centers. I'm not saying which center, if any center, should be closed. That will be determined once we get into it, once we start the interviewing process, when we start having all of the meetings. But at this present time, to adopt the Tyson amendment is absolutely the wrong direction.

SPEAKER BROMM: Time. Thank you, Senator Jensen. Senator Bourne.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you, Mr. President...Mr. Speaker, members. Senator Jensen, I appreciate your leadership in this area. I know that you've worked long and hard on evaluating this and we all know that we need to get ahold of our costs to aid to individuals. I've heard Senator Jensen, at meetings, talk about how our...the aid to individual portion of our budget is increasing at 14 to 18 percent and we need to...we need to figure out new ways to address these problems and solve these huge problems that we're going to have. Senator Jensen, at one time, and I'm going to ask you a quick question, you had said something that in, like, 15 or 20 years that if we don't change the way we're funding aid to individuals, and that is a...this is a component of that, that that will make up about 80 percent
