SENATOR JENSEN: (Microphone malfunction) That is correct. By the year 2020...

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Jensen.

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes. Excuse me. By the year 2020, if we do not change the 14.5 percent increase per year that we're having now, by the year 2020 it will make up 80 percent of our budget. We just got out of a meeting with Senator Wehrbein in a briefing and that leaves 20 percent to run schools, corrections and all the other facilities of the state.

SENATOR BOURNE: I remember hearing that statistic from you and it's shocking, and I think if we don't act now that's going to sneak up on us before we know it and we will not be able to get ahold of these costs. And, Senator Jensen, I do have another question for you. I appreciate that you had said this was intent language only. You're not advocating that we close any regional center now. Do you know, is this kind of the nationwide trend to go towards...more towards community-based mental health care? Is that a...

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR BOURNE: ...that's a national trend?

SENATOR JENSEN: That is a national trend.

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay.

SENATOR JENSEN: And, matter of fact, there are even some federal dollars that...in grant form that will help you set up those community-based services.

SENATOR BOURNE: So we're moving away nationally from the regional center concept towards more of a community based.

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.
