SENATOR TYSON: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. Ladies and gentlemen, I stated, when Senator Thompson wasn't listening, that I have no problem with closing down one or all of the regional centers. The smallest of the regional centers happens to be Norfolk. But there have been a few things put out. Number one, there is a campus in Norfolk. There is one active building there. The other buildings have been empty since the early seventies. One which was being used by some county services has been vacant now for I think two years, and that's the oldest building there. It's called the Stone Building. There is an apartment house that is used by faculty and some of the physicians, but primarily you're talking about two buildings and the power generation house, which is steam primarily, heating and air conditioning for the one building. There is a price to be paid, and I don't know what that price is. I don't believe that any of the other buildings, with the exception of the Veteran's Administration Eby and Patton Buildings, in Norfolk are salvageable. The difficulty is, as Senator Jensen pointed out, they have any number of problems in tearing them down. Before you start to tear them down you're going to have to remove the asbestos, and now it is safe in place. In other words, the danger of asbestos doesn't begin until you begin to move it, to agitate it, to get some fibers in the air, one thing and the other. Also, because these buildings have been shut down for probably 30 years and have had zero maintenance, there are broken windows, which invite pigeons, which invite filth, and that would also have to be taken care of before you could dynamite them. That, however, since they're not taking it...there's two of them in that condition. One is being used now for I believe maintenance and stores, but the other buildings, the ones we're talking about that are of no value, I don't know. Perhaps if Senator Jensen would respond to a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Jensen, would you respond?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR TYSON: Are those on a 309 roster, or are those on an HHS roster?
