that when you go to work there. So those are the things that have come out of this that have been good. And I think that we should move the bill ahead now and get it on the books. With that, thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Vrtiska. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Mr. President, members of the body. I also rise to support the...this amendment. I think it is much more understandable and clear-cut to understand exactly where it is, much like Senator Vrtiska said. And I rise to support it. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Bromm, there are no further lights on. You're recognized to close on your amendment if you care to.

SPEAKER BROMM: I waive closing.

SENATOR CUDABACK: He waives the opportunity to close. The question before the body is adoption of AM1599 to LB 210. All in favor of the motion vote aye, opposed nay. We're voting on adoption of AM1599. Have you all voted who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Bromm's amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The motion was successful.

CLERK: Senator Beutler would move to amend, AM1584. (Legislative Journal page 1493.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler to open on your amendment, AM1584.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Cudaback, members of the Legislature, this is the second half of the agreement. And it basically indicates that if you are under ten, then in that case you need to notify the employee who is coming to work for you, at the
