time that you hire them, that they're not going to be covered. And it's a very important notice for that employee and for the family, because that coverage may turn out to be something critical, or the lack thereof. And so giving them the opportunity to know what's happening and to make a decision is very, very important. And I would reiterate that there is a serious provision with relationship to not giving the notice, and that is that essentially that employee will come under the system. So that's the way it works. And I think that's a fair trade-off for such a high number as ten, from my perspective. Like all compromises, you don't feel very joyful about the whole thing. And...but that's the nature of a compromise. So I thank you for your consideration and for the time that you've listened to Senator Bromm and myself on this bill.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Opening on AM1584. Seeing no lights on, Senator Beutler, did you wish to close on your amendment? He waives the opportunity to close. The question before the body is adoption of AM1584 to LB 210. All in favor of the motion vote aye, opposed nay. We're voting on adoption of AM1584 to LB 210. Have you all voted who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.
