SENATOR WEHRBEIN:      At this point, but under...I don't...I'm listening to the debate.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:      But it remains like that for five years, doesn't it?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN:      Well, there is a transition, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:      Thank you, because the time will run out and neither of us could say much. Thank you, Senator.

SPEAKER BROMM:      Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Wehrbein, your light is next.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN:      Yes, Mr. President, Speaker and members, the only thing I wanted to call the body's attention to, there was a question or two raised a little bit ago about what we are doing now. It's on page 34. There is a table, Table 18, the Coordinating Commission Student Aid Programs, and gives a little bit of the history; 2000, 2001, '02, '03, '04, and '05, so that you can see the breakdown, what it's been doing, how the \$4 million comes into it in the second part of this next fiscal year. That was the intent of my...that was the only thing I was going to talk about as I...the reason I raised my light, and to say that I did support Senator Raikes' proposal here or the Education Committee's proposal. And I think it does...I understand the transition may not be rapid enough for someone, but I was...that's all I wanted to call attention is the history, and with that I'd turn my remaining time over to Senator Raikes, if he'd like it.

SPEAKER BROMM:      Senator Raikes,...

SENATOR RAIKES:      Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM:      ...you have four minutes.

SENATOR RAIKES:      Thank you, Senator Wehrbein.

SPEAKER BROMM:      There are no lights on. You could use this for
