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reserve. We seem to have bottomed out on revenues. That's a good reserve. If you did the Appropriations Committee scenario, the bottom of the sheet, you see we would be doing cuts and transfers in the amount of about \$400 million, and revenue increases in the amount of about \$350,000. So the total revenue package to do the \$350 million is less than half of the gap that we're addressing. We've addressed more of it with cuts and transfers than we would be with revenues, even if you do the whole \$350 million in revenues. So it's a very doable piece in light of the damage that the committee thought would be done to our institutions, particularly our education institutions. That damage level...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...was unacceptable between...below the \$350 million level. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Brashear, on AM1111.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. I listened attentively to what Senator Beutler said and I understand it. The figure that I'm using, until somebody informs us differently about LB 759, is \$160 million rather than \$140 million, so that might not drive all of Senator Beutler's proposals. But for myself, and I hope it's all right with you, we spent two and a half days talking about revenue earlier, so it's fine with me if we now start...if we now spend two and a half days, at least, for and on behalf of the people, talking about appropriations. So I'm sure you'll all turn around and frown at me when I've talked too much so then I'll sit down, but I'd, more than once and twice and three times, I'd like to develop some thoughts that are troubling to me. Yes, Senator Schimek, that's one, to sit down, so...but, see, I just got a bunch of smiles and that's an encouragement to continue. I once served on the Appropriations Committee under Senator Wehrbein and I remember those days, and I'm not certain I remember them fondly, but then if you go on to the Judiciary Committee it's probably macht nicht. But I've certainly forgotten a lot of things and I want to examine a number of things. You know,
