those things, because I often get ridiculed down here quietly and what I offer is rejected. I had wanted to take that money away from this Municipal Infrastructure Redevelopment Fund and I was rejected on that. But now, as Senator Thompson pointed out on that day, that it might had been best to do away with that and keep this other fund that gives money to local governments, and I said if you all come back it's going to be like the dog returning to his vomit. Do you remember me saying that? But that's not really what I want to talk about right now. Oh, Senator Thompson said not before lunch. Considering that, I might only want to talk about that now. But, really, what we're kind of doing here, at least let me speak for myself, is staking out positions. I want to get rid of PEAP; I want to restore that second year funding to the so-called advocacy agencies, the Mexican American Commission, the Indian Commission, and I believe that the Women's Commission ought to be funded. It is interesting to me that such concerted, ferocious attacks are made against agencies where not much money is involved anyway. They never were funded adequately to carry out the charge given to them, but they have always been vulnerable and available for attack to make it appear that something is being done to balance the budget, to help the taxpayers. But if you eliminated them altogether, you have not even created a complete drop in the bucket compared to where we are. So I'm going to be obstreperous, I'm going to be an obstructionist, I'm going to be a "grumbletonian," and I'm going to make it as difficult as I can around here for anybody to do anything they're trying to do as long as they're going to make it difficult for me to try to do the little that I'm trying to do. On the one hand, I'm trying to take away an expenditure that I think is not justified for the state to be making anyway while we're strapped financially. That expenditure I want to do away with relates to money to these private schools. And if you do that, it will more than fund these agencies that I'm talking about which we created, which we have given certain discriminated-against, disadvantaged persons the right to rely on. Then we're going to jerk the rug out from under them under the pretext of doing something about the budget. So I wanted to be clear what positions I'm staking out and to let you know that I'm very serious about this. I also like some of what Senator Dwite Pedersen said about all this money going to prisons. Some
