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about it, but it's the truth. You get what you pay for. You can get a \$30,000 professor. I'm not sure you're going to want him. We probably pay Senator Landis more than that for teaching an hour or two, you know, a week. He's worth that much. He didn't hear that. But you know, you get what you pay for. You really do. And I mean that in a good way. I'm sorry. I meant that in the best way you can take it. Okay. But you get what you pay for. You can cut the university. You can cut K through 12. But the picture is, you know, they can only absorb so much. They're not going to absorb it. It's going to be like a piece of glass, or a piece of silk. It's going to run right off. And I don't care what you do, I really don't, but when they get their tax statement, I want you to be prepared. I want you to be prepared when they say, that Legislature really cut, it really cut, it really did, look at my statement here, my tax statement. It's going to reflect that. Has to. there's no other way around it. I've been on both sides. I've been on county board. I've been on...you don't want to hear that again. I said...I told Senator Pederson (phonetic) I would never mention that again. Sorry, Senator Pederson. He's not here. But anyhow, I've been on both sides. I've been on the SID councils. I've been on a lot of boards. When you cut here, you're shifting. That's all we're going to do. We're going to shift. Now, how much you want to shift, that's the decision we've got to make here. I'm not even picking sides. But the decision we're going to have to make here is how much we want to shift. That's it. I'm very careful here. But anyway, we've got to determine what we're going to do here. Shift? Ask Senator Wehrbein, you know. He's taking it all in here. You think that was a picnic being on that Appropriations Committee? You think that was a picnic, sitting in there with these nice...I love the people in there, and we had a good committee. Really, when we left, we were friends. I don't know how come, but we were. It's not easy when you're trying to cut. It's easy for Jim Cudaback to cut when he's not facing anybody. But looking somebody in the eye and saying, I'm going go cut you by half, speaking of the Indian Affairs, the...
