try to phase out this program. I want to cut it. The present form of the bill contains cuts to public education. I am aware that at this point in the day people are tired. You've been here a long time. You have discussed the same subject long enough to have become saturated. But as long as we are here, our workday has not ended and my work never ends, figuratively speaking. But I am prepared to work many more hours on this bill, so here's what I would recommend. Forgetting ideology, forgetting everything except political reality, this amendment should be adopted. The cut that I'm recommending should be made. As we proceed, if the body thinks that it is prudent to restore this money, an attempt could be made to do that, and I would fight the attempt. I don't want there to be any misperceptions about what my position is. We're going to be on this budget bill for awhile on General File and for a longer while on Select File. People may have decided that it's too difficult to do the heavy lifting on this bill, as was decided about others, and perhaps there will be a folding of tents and no serious efforts made to alter the bill, and it will be moved on across the board. But I cannot follow that path. If this amendment is adopted, I have one other one that I intend to offer and it's on your gadget now. It would restore the second year of funding for the Commission on Mexican American Affairs, the second year of funding for the Commission on Indian Affairs, restore the funding for the first and second year for the Commission on the Status of Women. That sounds like a great deal, but the amount involved with the Commission on Mexican American Affairs would be less than \$200,000,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...\$198,796; for the Commission on Indian Affairs, \$173,817; for the Commission on the Status of Women, \$380,488; for a total of \$753,101. Less than a million dollars is what I would be trying to restore to the budget while offering to cut \$4.2 million. I will see how the debate proceeds. Thank you, Mr. President.
