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about raising tuition?

SENATOR ENGEL: That's what I read in the paper, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you think they're actually going to do it?

SENATOR ENGEL: If they have to, they will.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'm asking what your opinion is. In your opinion, do you think they will have to do that?

SENATOR ENGEL: In my opinion, under the present cuts that we made now, and we've reduced the cuts from the original Governor's cuts, I think it's about 3 percent, if they raise them...if they raise tuition I think it will have to be...it'd be very slight.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But they're going to.

SENATOR ENGEL: That's my opinion. That's what you asked for.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But now will that tuition raise involve only students who freshly enroll at the university, or will it involve those that have been attending there already?

SENATOR ENGEL: Well, that will involve all students, I'm sure.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So those who came in paying one rate of tuition are going to have to pay a higher rate if the tuition is increased, is that true, whatever the tuition increase is?

SENATOR ENGEL: That's my assumption, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And if they can't pay the amount with the increased tuition, is the university going to tell them, well, you can go here without paying that amount?

SENATOR ENGEL: I doubt that very much.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Those kids would have to find another school to go to. Is that true?
