I can't convince you to do the right thing, but there are others who will convince you, or they'll bludgeon you into submission, or you'll get to thinking about which of the two things is more important. Whenever you face a bad defeat, it is unwise to undertake any serious activity while you're under the emotions of defeat. When you are tired, when you have not been able to keep your defenses up and your emotions are going to run away with you, it is not wise to do things that you might want to undo later. So I'm taking all of this time to give everybody the opportunity to think at leisure. Sleep on it tonight. Have a good meal. If you have a significant other, sit down, but don't discuss it with that significant other because you're the one who's in public office, not that significant other. They did nothing to deserve that punishment other than make the mistake of being your significant other and for that they should not be punished that severely.
