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you ought to vote on this kind of issue when it comes back up on the May the 25th, if Senator Chambers actually continues and leaves the bracket motion up there. But I just wanted to get up and express a few words of my own about this issue, and my concern about not only those schools who are providing education for kids, but also for our state institutions who are pledged to provide an education for our kids. So you can understand the trouble, the trouble that we have in our minds and hearts when we talk about these kinds of issues, and it becomes very difficult for us to come to what we consider, and that's what I want to do. When I get ready to vote, I want to make sure that I made the right decision. Right now, I don't know what the right decision is. So I'm not going to take any more time with this issue simply because I still want to sit and listen, but I want to end up by saying, again, I appreciate Senator Chambers' efforts on behalf of a bunch of kids who were being very unfairly treated, and for that I'm grateful that he stepped in. With that, I'll give the rest of my time to Senator Chambers, if he'd like it.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, you have about one minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. Thank you, Senator Vrtiska. And, members of the Legislature, there are hard problems that face a lot of people and many on this floor will never know about them. I remember, now that I'm giving accolades, when Senator Stuhr and I sat on a panel in a town where there had been some very disturbing activities and we were out there trying to resolve it, and I had had threats made against me about what would happen if I came to that town. I didn't bring body guards or anything else, and I didn't even know Senator Stuhr was going to be there. But when I got there, there she was, sitting at the desk with me, or table, whatever it was. And that is not my town. That is not my district. But there were people who needed help and they called on me and I went. And I'm just saying that to suggest to you all that I understand problems that people have, but none of that will deter me from what I'm attempting to do here because I believe what I'm doing here is right.
