State Electrical Board. I will go through the appointments to the Arts Council first. The first one we heard was for Mrs. Louise Bereuter. She's a reappointment to the council. She has extensive experience and education in the arts, including teaching as an art teacher for over 20 years. She has served on various boards and associations supporting the arts. And she is the wife of Congressman Doug Bereuter, from the 1st Congressional District. The second appointment we had was Joan Gibson. She is a new appointment, from Omaha. She has studied art history and the studio arts, and has a long history of involvement in that field. She has served in the Omaha arts community, including projects for Joslyn Art Museum, as a member of the Opera Council, and on several literacy projects. Another new appointment we had was Robin Koozer. She is from Hastings. Or, he is from Hastings. He has extensive education in music and music education, and has been a music teacher at Hastings College since 1989. He has served on boards and associations involving music for decades, and has received honors such as the outstanding young Nebraska choral music educator. The third...or, fourth appointment we heard to the Arts Council was that of Elwood "Art" Thompson. He is a new appointee, from Eagle, Nebraska. His education includes a master of arts in English from UNL, and he is the president of the Cooper Foundation. He has worked on various art projects in the past, including the Interstate 80 bicentennial sculpture project. The next appointment we heard was a reappointment. This person is from York. His name is Robert Wolfe. He is the owner of the Bits 'N Pieces Art Gallery in York. He's a past chairman of the Association of Nebraska Art Clubs, and a past member of the Omaha Symphony. The last one we heard was a lady from Broken Bow, Nebraska, Meredith Zutavern. She is a reappointment, from the city of Broken Bow. She specializes in textiles, and she teaches young women in older...the older forms of manufacturing of textile and working with them. That is the...shall I take the rest of the Electrical Board then too, right along? Or do you want to just stop on the Arts Council? Okay. I would highly recommend all of these appointments to the Arts Council, the new appointments and the reappointments.
