SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, I would give whatever time left that I have to Senator Wehrbein.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: All right. Thank you, Senator Chambers. Three minutes and thirty seconds, Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Mr. President, I would like to divide the question that...of Senator Chambers' amendment, and divide it according to the Mexican-American Commission, the Indian America (sic) Commission as one part of the amendment, and the Status of Women as another part of the amendment.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. The amendment is divisible. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Well, Mr. President, Senator Chambers may inquire as to which component you'd like to take up first, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, I would like to take the two commissions first, which would be lines 6 through 17. Wait a minute.

CLERK: No, that would be lines 9 through 17, I think, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, lines 9 through 17.
