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correct?

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, this has nothing to do with the cash fund; General Fund.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: General Fund.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay. It doesn't have anything to do with the PEAP funds...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...that we were discussing yesterday.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: There is no money diverted from some other program to this.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: This is just standing free.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Just General Funds.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay. Thank you very much. I appreciate that. Members, I really believe that we need to continue the existence of these two commissions and I'm not certain what Senator Thompson is going to propose. I have an inkling of what she might be proposing. And I feel very strongly that there's more need for these two commissions than there ever has been before, and I don't think that's a short-term need. I think there is a definite need to continue them on into the future. And one of the reasons is, of course, with the Mexican-American Commission, that the population of that particular group is just expanding so rapidly in Nebraska, and there's all kinds of immigration problems, language problems, problems with the laws
