go to get some advice, some assistance of one kind or another. Maybe referrals will be made. Perhaps going to a commission and seeing women in charge of anything will be an inspiration to other women. I remember when Anita Hill withstood that withering interrogation, inquisitorial interrogating by these male senators without shedding a tear, without stammering. Without any help, she faced them down and rose as a tower of dignity that inspired women and men all over this country. Women began to run for offices. In legislatures they formed women's caucuses. But without an Anita Hill to provide that spark of inspiration, all of that went away. What is needed is something that can sustain itself and provide that ongoing encouragement and inspiration that females in this society need. The young women need to see successful women. I believe in making deliberate, intentional, premeditated judgments to place women in highly visible positions with authority, independence, so they can show what women are capable of. And as long as women are discriminated against, a tremendous pool of talent and ability is being underused. And until America can overcome that, this country will never be great. Don't just talk about leaving no child behind. Let's not leave anybody behind. I'm in favor of restoring this money. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. You've heard the opening on the first part of the divided amendment. (Visitors introduced.) On with discussion of the Chambers amendment, part one, FA1341. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'm going to rise to oppose Senator Chambers' amendment in this case. This is one of the very difficult decisions that our committee had to make. If you notice, we returned...we took the General Fund to zero. We didn't statutorily discount the Status of Women, but simply took the funding to zero, feeling that there could be some alternative sources for funding that could be sought. It's not to discount the things that Senator Chambers has said. It's just one of those areas that we have to make some very difficult decisions in many, many other areas. This was one that we felt probably could go without the General Fund support for awhile. If...that will be kind of up to the body where this goes, but this is for the next two years. If
