ASSISTANT CLERK: I have nothing further pending to the bill.

SPEAKER BROMM: There being no further discussion, Senator Wehrbein, you're recognized to close on the advancement of LB 424.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I'll waive closing.

SPEAKER BROMM: Closing is waived. The question then is the advancement of LB 424 to E & R Initial. All in favor vote aye, and opposed nay. Please record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 33 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance the bill.

SPEAKER BROMM: LB 424 is advanced. Senator Thompson, I have a note that you may wish to pass over LB 440 at this time. Is that correct?

SENATOR THOMPSON: Yes.

SPEAKER BROMM: We will pass over LB 440 and go to LB 798.

ASSISTANT CLERK: LB 798 was introduced by the Appropriations Committee and signed by its members. (Read title.) The bill was read for the first time on February 28, referred to the Appropriations Committee. That committee reported the bill to General File with committee amendments attached.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Wehrbein, you're recognized to open on LB 798.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay. Mr. Speaker, members, the original bill transferred \$3 million from the Cash Reserve Fund each year to the General Fund. And that originally was designed to support the cigarette cessation program. In our amendment, we've added also, at this time, the money that we talked about yesterday for the veterans home in Omaha.
