presented for us through an amendment to strike that part of the bill, either now, or I suppose that could also be done on Select File if that were the preference. I don't want to blindside anybody by doing it in a rash manner. But it seems to me that that decision needs to be put before us, so that we see whether we want to stick with the Cash Fund...Cash Reserve transfers or not. And I was trying to figure out how to draft an amendment. And I think I know, but I'm not 100 percent sure. Senator Wehrbein, have you had a chance to look at that yet?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: No, I haven't really. We think we have it right, but I'm a little hesitant to jump right into it until it's confirmed, Senator Bromm. I don't know if there's a way that we could move on and come back, if that's the case. I do have some comments on it. We...if I may say, if we take \$6 million off the revenue side, we're going to widen our gap \$6 million. I just wanted to call attention to that.

SPEAKER BROMM: I understand that.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yeah.

SPEAKER BROMM: And that's definitely the downside. But if we're going to close the gap with Cash Reserve transfers, we can always do that in any manner and number of...several different manners. But I guess I would...the decision, for me, is whether to just go ahead and let the bill advance and come back to this on Select after some more discussion. And perhaps that's the more prudent thing to do, rather than make you and everybody else scramble at this point. So that's probably what I will plan to do, unless someone else has a different plan. Thank you, Madam President.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Beutler, you are the next speaker. Senator Beutler waives. Senator Preister, you're recognized to speak.
