is your intent also. Right, Senator?

SENATOR JENSEN: You're exactly right, Senator Byars. Like I said, it's been a good program. If we weren't in the financial condition that we were, I would fight to keep it going. And certainly when times improve somewhere down the road, hopefully we can institute it and fund it again so it can operate. This is for the biennial and so we'll see what happens two years from now, if we can then again put dollars back into this program to fund the grant program. That's certainly my intention.

SENATOR BYARS: Right. Thank you, Senator Jensen. It certainly is my intention also that we do. I don't see a need for a sunset. We'll revisit this on the biennial appropriations process. But I'll take a moment, too, to commend those people who have been appointed by the Governor who have sat on this committee and made the decisions on where these grant funds are allocated. They have done a wonderful job. They have been very thoughtful and sensitive in where these grants have been placed and I think in every instance they have been grants that have been very, very worthwhile. So again, I stand in favor of LB 412 and yield my time back to the Chair.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Byars. Further discussion? Senator Stuthman.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, I would also like to ask a question of Senator Jensen. Would he respond, please?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Jensen, would you yield from Senator Stuthman?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes, Senator Stuthman.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: In this grant program, are there any grants that are out there right now that will need any funding in the future? It states that these grants are not to exceed three years in duration. Or has this program ever been utilized or can you give me any information on that? I am not aware of this.
