SENATOR PREISTER: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. I would like to see the tire problem just go away. But like tires on vehicles, it just keeps rolling along. And every year we revisit it, and every year we tinker with it, and every year we make changes that we hope will improve the process. That's a part of our process. We have done good things. We have had successes. We have cleaned up a lot of tire piles. But we're not all the way there yet. And we do keep...continue to generate new tires. And those new tires wear out, and then we have to find a way to dispose of them. And we try to do it the best that we can. The committee has worked on this issue year, after year, after year, and we likely will continue to work on it on into the future. The interim study that we will be doing I think will be a very comprehensive one, as Senator Connealy was talking about, and as Senator Schrock has already committed to, as have the rest of the committee members. We can look at what's being done and what's successful in other states. We can incorporate some things. We also have some limitations. But we will continue to work through the committee. We will continue to work with all of the various stakeholders, the State Recycling Association, as well as each of the individual businesses that are working to contribute to the solution. Sometimes those folks don't always see our component and what we do in making the laws in trying to help them, as being helpful. So I pledge that we will continue working with those groups. DEQ will continue working with those groups, as I have asked and as they have said they would. And the committee is willing to do that. We're trying to work together collectively with everyone for the best interest of the programs, the best interest of recycling, and the best interest of the state. To that end, I thank Senator Schrock for his efforts in the leadership role he's played on this issue. Sometimes, as a committee Chair, he's taken heat. Sometimes it's not been deserved, and sometimes he has been understood in his motives. But he has done a good job. The other senators, Connealy and Cunningham and McDonald, have also worked to represent their constituents very well, to advocate for their constituents and to try and seek a workable, agreeable solution to the problem. So there have been many meetings. I thank each of those senators, as well as DEQ, for the role that they have played.
