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And by allowing a process to be laid out as guidelines to accomplish those best practices, if you will, that's what we're trying to accomplish. We are on varying scales throughout the state when it comes to the levels and the decisions and the discussions that are made in regards to any type of conditional use permit. This doesn't just apply to livestock. This applies to a number of other permits that are requested from citizens of individual counties. And regardless of whether they approve the permit or not, if there is a process that we can point to in the state of Nebraska, as lawmakers, and say here is a standard that we are willing to set the bar at, I think this is...that's a reasonable approach. And I think what we're accomplishing here is that. So hesitate a little bit on my part to jump in and say, well, this is some new idea because it's not our own in the first place. It's those who are on the front lines doing it. And if there are concerns to clarify, we're willing to do that, at least I am. I think we had some discussions on General File, Senator Beutler and myself, trying to clarify where we're headed. I think those discussions were beneficial. I think Senator Bromm and Senator Kremer and their staff have also been a part of the discussions with both sides, trying to set a process that looks like what is fair. So I rise in support of what some of the counties in the state are already doing, in hopes that we can encourage and provide a framework to get all counties to do the same thing. It's working in those counties. It's been pointed to by both sides of the debate today that this is a good example.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR ERDMAN: And I think we can work through some of the questions as far as language and some of the things that are in the bill. I would also like to kind of frame something within the discussion. The final determination information that's in the committee amendment that was adopted hinges upon the individual receiving applicable state and federal permits. And so I don't know if someone that's going to build a garage is going to request a final determination, because that's a short process. I don't know if someone that's going to build a bed and breakfast is going to request a final determination; that, you know, those are going to be local issues. I don't know if
