the bill, with the original wording or with the amendment, I have some concerns. I don't know whether we're doing what we want to do, and I think what we really want to do is help counties get to where they want to be and do the job efficiently and not have other impediments in their way. What I think we might be doing is adding more litigation. You know, "timely manner" is litigable. We tend to talk about how people sue too much and how we are always in the courts. This is some of the actions that we do to cause that to happen more and more. We're asking county boards to make more decisions earlier with maybe less information. I'm worried that with a final determination up at the front, with mandated from the state, that we'd actually have counties raise the bar higher initially because of the fact that they're worried about things that they would...that would come up later in the discussion and we could happen to have a detrimental effect on siting (inaudible) in areas that may be able to work out if they went through the normal process. I'm worried that we're taking an industry, county zoning, which is really relatively new in Nebraska, lots of counties are just a couple years into this, and then setting a new rule in place for them. I think that we're addressing a problem in the wrong direction. If we really wanted to help in this area, help counties site these plants and get these operations in their counties, I think that we'd have one or two people added to the Department of Ag to help counties do that, to work through the process to make sure that they use facts and have the right information. We're not doing that because we don't have the money to do that. I'm worried about this section of the bill.
