And so that's all intended to be reasonable and would be my perception of reasonable. Now if the request goes on and on and on to the point that, in order to even get an indication of whether I'm going to have a chance here, I've got to spend \$50,000 in order to answer that question. And if it's a big facility, you know, I might have to do that. My other choice is to withdraw the application. Say, look, I think it's unreasonable and I'm not going to be able to furnish that; I'm going to go away now before I spend a couple hundred thousand dollars. And that was the point I was going to make on your first question, was I think this facilitates the ability for an applicant to make an earlier decision on whether they should continue to pursue building here or not, rather than wasting a lot of time, money and anguish to get to that point. That is the main benefit of this provision, I believe. I'm on my...I'm still on my...

SENATOR CUDABACK: It's your time, Senator Bromm. It's your time.

SPEAKER BROMM: How much time do I have left?

SENATOR CUDABACK: About almost two and a half minutes.

SPEAKER BROMM: Okay, thank you. I wanted to make a couple of other comments and, Senator Beutler, I'm sorry if I didn't completely answer the question, but if I didn't I would suspect you may ask it again. The suggestion that this applies...could apply to things other than livestock is correct and if this is good policy then it's good policy for other people as well, for other situations. If there's something about this policy that we should narrow it only to livestock permits, I'm willing to talk about that. That's not been proposed to me by anyone, but if that's what the body would prefer to do, I'm willing to talk about that. But I don't see anything in this policy as onerous for anything else. I think it is...and it is possible, Senator Connealy, that there might be counties who would raise the bar so high right away that they would discourage the applicant. Fine. Then the applicant knows to go to a different county if they want to pursue the operation, or to go to Kansas, as described by Senator Baker, before they buy the land and before
