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as well try to support it and try to get it on so if it helps the bill and helps some people, be it, that's got a lot of concerns about it. I've had calls from commissioners in different parts of the state that had some concerns about it, and after I explained it to them, well, that kind of satisfied them because I think a lot of counties are already doing this. I think it's...they're feeling like they're a friendly livestock county and they're really helping out and trying to get it. I know there's several instances, you know, well, you know, emotion is a big problem, you know? And a good example of that was at the time they was trying to build one hog house in Arthur County. I was up to that. I went up there to visit with the commissioners. Well, before we could quite get there, well, a big group from Perkins County came up there in protest of it. So there's a lot of emotion sometimes when you're talking about big hog units. But we're not talking about that here. We're just trying to figure out how we can help anybody that wants to get a new livestock operation after they go through the steps and get all the things in order. And hopefully they can get their factual reasons for or against it from the county commissioners before they spend a lot of money, and that's the whole...the whole thing about it. And I...people got all kinds of ideas on this one way or another, but that's the main gist of the bill, is try to get the...some information up-front and have factual reasons why you do it and so that they can go ahead and try to get something started without spending a lot of money ahead of time. So I think I want to support this amendment and go ahead and support the bill. I'd like to give the rest of my time to Senator Vrtiska.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Vrtiska, about two minutes have been elapsed. Senator Vrtiska, did you wish to use Senator...your light is next anyhow, Senator Vrtiska.

SENATOR VRTISKA: I call the question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Not using Senator Jones' time.
