SENATOR HARTNETT: So thank you for your comments. I'll give the time back to the Chair.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Hartnett. Senator Bromm, there are no further lights on. Did you wish to close on your amendment, AM1694?

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Mr. President. Very briefly, the amendment would restrict the bill to the application of the conditional use permit process that's contained, to agricultural operations, to special permits and applications for permits, and with agricultural livestock operations. And so most counties have the availability of livestock operations being subject to a conditional use permit in their agricultural zoned areas. And this is what that would apply to, not to other types of uses, whether it be the gentleman's club or something else. This would not apply to that. So I would ask for your support for the amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bromm. You've heard the closing on AM1694, which is an amendment to LB 754. The question before the body is, shall that amendment be adopted? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. The question before the body is adoption of the Bromm amendment, AM1694. Have you all voted who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Bromm's amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Chambers would move to amend the bill. (FA1344, Legislative Journal page 1589.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, to open on your amendment to LB 754. The amendment is FA1344.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I myself am not sure just how serious I am about this amendment. But what it would do is strike all of the
