I'm sure all of us understand and know that we're not going to go back to those days when every farm had a few head of livestock, because it's just not going to happen. And I'd like to see, as somebody talked earlier, the small grocery store, the small filling station, those kind of operations. But they don't exist anymore, because they can't make a living. And that's the bottom line in agriculture, as it is in the other businesses. So I'm having a difficult time trying to understand the objection to some of the parts of the bill that I think are doing exactly what Senator Bromm expected to do when he introduced this bill. And it's taken a lot of hard work and a lot of time in order to bring this bill to the point where it is, where personally I think it's acceptable now. Because it still allows some discretion, some control over people who want to move into this field and build this kind of facilities and run this kind of a business. At the same time, they have to have...those who want to oppose them or support them, in any case, have to have the facts before they can do that. So to me, the bill is in the position now where I can support. I can support the amendment. I don't support Senator Chambers' amendment, because I think it destroys the entire bill. So I have a difficult time trying to support something that in fact erases out the part of the bill that's important for the purpose that it was put in there for. So I'm not going to spend a lot of time, because I'm going to sit back and listen, and hopefully learn more about what other people's attitudes are on this bill, and then make a determination on my vote, which at this present time would be a positive vote. And with that, thank you, Mr. President.
