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will not pollute; do that before you do that. That's all this is asking to do. Final determination, says final determination of all the requirements. And then there was a concern that that was the final final, so we amended that to say that the only way you could change it is if you've changed your...some of your procedures significantly. And if somebody does that, they should be denied. There's no question, they should be denied. If they come back and say that we're going to change it, we're going to have a lagoon instead of an under-the-house system or whatever it might be under the hog confinement house, then it should be denied if they change it from that. We need to get some kind of an idea whether we can meet the requirements or not. One thing I...when I'm stand...sitting here in the Chamber and listening to debate, I can think a lot more clearly after I get back home, and sometimes I'm amazed at what I think people think goes on. I get home and I think, my goodness, we're not polluting. There's no one that cares more about having clean water, nonpolluted water, nonpolluted air than we do that live right there and work with the livestock and work on the farm and we would...we do not want to change that. We want clean water. We want nonpolluted water. We don't want our livestock waste running into the streams. But in a practical sense, I think this bill makes a lot of sense. It does not change the zoning laws. It seemed like we started out to try to make it pretty simple to accomplish about four things. One was to have a statement that says what the actual findings are of what we want from you. Another one was to get information from the university or Department of Agriculture, someone to help us make that determination. And the other thing, just in a timely manner, know whether we can adhere to all these application...or these requirements before...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR KREMER: ...we go any further than that. It does not try to rewrite the zoning laws. It started out in another section; thought it would be more applicable to put it into the zoning regulations. It does not change the zoning regulations. I do not support the Beutler amendment and I do support the bill. Thank you.
