exercise more prudent judgment and does so. In other instances, pressure from powerful special interest groups could cause the politician to go through a weighing process, which will cause the least damage to him or her politically? To bow to the wishes of the special interest group contrary to what the constituency wants, or to resist that special interest group on behalf of the constituency. In many cases, the special interest group wins out. In this case, the county board, the zoning commission will speak for the people in that area. So I would tell Senator Wehrbein that if the people in the affected area do not want in their midst what people outside of their midst want to tell them is in their best interest, those people are free to reject what the outsiders tell them. The only way that Senator Wehrbein and others who support this bill can have their way, the only method by which these large operations can work their will is to impose that will on these localities. And the only way they can impose it is if the state does it for them. The state, Senator Wehrbein, will have to impose these large scale operations on these unwilling counties. So I have a proposition. In the old days there were two states that had a city by the same name, Abilene. Abilene, in both instances but especially in Kansas, was known as a cattle center. Much activity went on and they had those bovines with long horns,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: : One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...Senator Aguilar. They were called longhorns. But here is what the state would have to do or should do; designate a certain number of sparsely populated counties, relocate the people out of those counties who choose to accept relocation, as is the case when people in my area are victimized by urban renewal. Those who want to be relocated will be given a fair amount of money to allow them to relocate someplace else. These particular counties will be known as a livestock friendly region or center, and in those counties, huge spreads, huge numbers of livestock will be allowed to mill, move, live, and have their being. And in that manner, Nebraska, as a state, can be viewed as a mecca for those who want to have these huge operations.
