But he didn't ask the question. I didn't have the opportunity, and I never like to let a good line go by without it being articulated. My amendment is that disclaimer which ought not to have to be provided based on work we do as a Legislature, but, unfortunately, it is. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Chambers, there are no further lights on. You may close if you care to.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Members of the Legislature, the amendment is clear. I told you what it does. Senator Bromm has not resisted it and, in fact, supports it. Senator Kremer, the Chairperson of the Agriculture Committee, the committee which often goes astray but on occasion can do something which is right, the Chairperson of that committee supports this amendment. I will not take my entire five minutes. Mr. President, I will take a machine vote. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. You've heard the closing on FA1346, which is to LB 754. The question before the body is, should that amendment be adopted? All in favor of the motion vote aye, opposed nay. Voting on adoption of FA1346. Have you all voted who care to? Record, please, Mr. Clerk.
