SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR SMITH: Well, the intent is not to restrict areas of scientific research not specifically prohibited by the act. So it says that those subsequent issues.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: They are the ones that are not specifically prohibited. Is that correct? Is that the intention?

SENATOR SMITH: You mean, like, for plants and animals as opposed to human beings?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I meant all of them. All of those that follow are not prohibited...

SENATOR SMITH: That is correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Now, in line 8, research in the use of nuclear transfer is not prohibited if it's used for these purposes that are listed, such as to produce molecules, DNA, tissues, organs, plants, cells other than human embryos, or animals other than humans. So are we talking about using nuclear transfer as a means to produce human tissue?

SENATOR SMITH: There would be some who would say that creating a human embryo is merely creating tissue. And for that purpose, that would be banned. But certainly, this...

SENATOR RAIKES PRESIDING

SENATOR RAIKES: One minute.

SENATOR SMITH: ...this would not ban other types of cloning, so to speak.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So what other tissues are to be produced by this methodology? What other tissues?

SENATOR SMITH: Animal. Dolly the sheep.
