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SENATOR CHAMBERS: And organs. You're talking about producing animal organs? Why would you produce animal organs? I'm trying to get information and understand what's in your language here.

SENATOR SMITH: I can't answer that question. I mean, with the intent of the thousands of researchers across the nation.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. My time is up. I'll put my light on again.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Beutler, you're recognized to speak.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Raikes, members of the Legislature, I just have some questions to start with, of both Senator Schimek and Senator Smith, trying to understand what each is trying to do. And Senator Schimek, I might start with you and your amendment. I want to keep a very open mind to your amendment. But I wanted to ask you what your intent was. The way that the amendment is structured, you change the intent language of the bill. And then in Section 4, you change the language in subsection (3) having to do with the delivery or receipt of any embryo produced by or from human cloning. And my question is this. In making this change, was it your intent to cover all of the violations defined in subsection (4)? That is, did you want to qualify what human cloning is with respect to performing human cloning and with respect to deriving any product from human cloning, as well as subsection (3), which you specifically limited?

SENATOR RAIKES: Senator Schimek, would you yield?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I'm not certain I am understanding your question, Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Could you simplify it?

SENATOR BEUTLER: It's...yeah, I'm sorry. The...it seems to me that in order to effectuate your purpose you need to qualify the
