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SENATOR SMITH: That would be correct.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Okay. Senator Schimek, would you agree, or could you give me your answer as far as what you think the...

SENATOR RAIKES: One minute.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: ...therapeutic cloning really means?

SENATOR RAIKES: Senator Schimek, would you yield?

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Oh, I'm sorry. Would...what is your explanation as far as therapeutic cloning, how far...when is it started or when is it stopped, or can you explain that to me a little bit?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: What do you mean when is it started or when it is stopped?

SENATOR STUTHMAN: When the cells, when you have the egg, the cells, it was explained to me that you can take the one situation and insert it into a womb and it develops into a human being. The next would be it would develop but it's stopped along the way, depending upon the length of time that you want to do the research on the project. Am I explaining myself correctly, or not?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I would think that it wouldn't make a difference on what...

SENATOR RAIKES: Time.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...what kind of research you're doing, Senator. I'm not certain that I can answer your question.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Okay. My time is up. Thank you.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you, Senator Stuthman. Senator Smith, you're recognized to speak.
