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under my proposal, again, which is \$14 million on top of the \$4.5 million of the Landis amendment, or the Revenue Committee amendment to the Landis bill originally, if you drank a can of beer a day, every day, it would increase your yearly purchases \$6.16. If you drank a six-pack of beer per day, per day, it would cost you \$36.96 more at the end of the year. If you drank a case of beer a day, one case of beer a day...by the way, I had a friend that did that for a while, and you can understand what happened then, and he's not living on this earth anymore. But one case of beer per day would cost you \$147 at the end of the year more. And by the way, if you're drinking a case of beer a day, just like my friend, you're going to need treatment or you're going to need help very quickly. (Laugh) I...well, we don't charge people to go to the rest rooms anymore. But I did want to mention the amendment. And I don't like to do that before it's introduced. But...by the way, my amendment is not endorsed by the alcohol lobby. (Laugh) And...but I think, like Senator Kruse said, it's a way of getting some of our dollars back that we're spending. We are spending huge amount of dollars on treatment, incarceration, everything from spousal abuse to child abuse. And I'll go into those things later on. But I did want you to...

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR JENSEN: ...know, at least, if you haven't looked ahead, about this amendment. And you can certainly do with that what you wish. I do thank Senator Landis for...first of all, for proposing this; 1987 was the last time that, to my knowledge, that we increased alcohol taxes. My, take a look at the other tax increases that we've had along the way, and it's almost an insult that we would allow this to continue. Thank you, Mr. President. I'll return the rest of my time back.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Jensen. Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members of the body. I guess I'd like just to make a few comments. And I appreciate the remarks of Senator Beutler.
