process, I want to mention where we are. The committee amendment was rejected. We're working from the green copy. The green copy is the original proposal by Senator Landis. It is the one that I agree with that I support. However, I'm going to support Senator Jensen's amendment also because it raises the alcohol tax to an even greater extent. As to where the money is going, I can understand his earmarking it for treatment. However, at this point, being totally frank, I'm making political decisions. I want to see the tax on liquor raised as high as it can be raised, and if to get that done Senator Jensen's amendment, along with the earmarking, must be accepted, I will do that. So here is where I'm positioned. For once, I cannot lose at this point. The green copy of the bill is the one that I strongly favor. If Senator Jensen's amendment is adopted, that is even better. So I would consider that a tremendous win for what I think ought to be done. If perchance his amendment should be rejected, we have the green copy of the bill, which I would consider to be a win. I would then advocate very strongly that we advance the bill. It would be different in its contents from what is in Senator...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...I was waiting for that; I thought it was close...in Senator Brashear's bill, and I prefer Senator Landis' proposal over that of Senator Brashear. Therefore, I think both bills should be kept alive. Senator Brashear's is alive, obviously. I would like to see, and I would advocate, that we advance Senator Landis' bill with or without the Jensen amendment. I want to thank Senator Hartnett for that time. Then I can have a little more to say when I'm recognized. Thank you, Mr. President.
