have come through, wouldn't have gotten two and a half days of debate without the Revenue Committee issuing it. It wouldn't have gotten to Select File without...I can't remember the number...more than 25 of all of you saying it could go to Select File. And we are still here all together discussing how we shape a strategy for discharging our function, our responsibility, and our duty. It would consistent with my opening comment that you mentioned briefly, Senator Beutler. This morning, it would be my hope to keep all of the component parts of LB 759 together as they are...I support them...and to add to them those things which must be added in order that we can have a nearly complete...I'll explain that in a minute...a nearly complete single package to offer to the people and to the Governor as being our work product with regard to revenue. Now, my exception was going to be...and I'm prepared to be flexible. That's the advantage of being on Select File; we're already there. My exception was that I was going to say, all right, the Revenue Committee has issued what was, I believe, LB 283. Let's do all of the estate inheritance tax, liquor tax, let's do those things there, pass them with 33 votes, get them done, and make them effective at an earlier date. I also don't think it's some sort of a meltdown experience if we don't do it. Because while I never want to be accused of treating \$1 million or so lightly, the fact of the matter is we are about much more than \$1 million of accelerated revenue collection. So I don't think that is determinative of how we do our work. I will continue to urge that we keep LB 759 in the shape it's in. And that I...and I will offer amendments, they're being prepared, to add to it the things that we need to add to it so it can be a single package, and that we can utilize it as such. Is that responsive, Senator Beutler?

SENATOR BEUTLER: I think it is, Senator. And with the short time that I have left, Senator Bromm, if I could ask you a couple of questions, I would like to know what your intention is, as Speaker, with regard to Senator Brashear's bill. If and when it advances from Select File, in whatever form that it advances, will it be put up...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.
