important that we are forced to come back and look at the total package and see what kind of structure we need in this state so that we have a potential for growth. I'm one who happens to agree with Senator Brashear that the growth of our economy is in the service industry. If you look at the GDP, you will see that's where the growth of our economy is. So if we really want to structure ourselves to move along in our tax receipts with the growth of our economy, this old scheme is not where we really want to be, but I think there's general agreement that's where we're going to go right now to solve the dilemma before us. But I think it's important that we look at this creatively and that we put a deadline on ourselves to do so. Now we may decide we're going to just go on, but we're going to have to come back with some additional tax because this doesn't fill \$803 million. Now I also think it's very interesting because Senator Landis, of all the people in this body, is the author of the temporary whatever. When he introduced the cigarette tax it was let's try it; we'll put a sunset on it and we'll just try it and see if we don't get the results in reduced smoking. And when he introduced LB 1085 last year it was, here's the sunsets; let's just try these temporary taxes and see if this doesn't solve it, and then we'll take another look. It was the sweetener to get everyone to buy in, but now that it's here, well, we shouldn't look at it again. I think it's always good to look at it again. I don't think there's anything wrong with looking at it again. I don't think there's anything wrong with confirming an action that you've taken before and saying that was the right action, but I like the idea of looking at it carefully to affirm it or to change directions. I think it's good for a future Legislature to look at it. We don't have to do the work for them. We need to do the work for us today and let them take up their task when they face it. So I think it's really interesting. Many, many times this has been the sweetener. Who knows? Maybe that's the sweetener you need to get the Governor's signature on this bill. Do you know? I don't know. Anyway, it's a choice. You can leave yourself flexibility, you can leave yourself that opportunity to reexamine our structure, or you can lock yourself in and see if you can get somebody to move off of dead center, because it's awfully hard, it's awfully hard. Once things are set in place, it's just too easy, it's too comfortable to keep going down that
