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living close to South Dakota, that these last several years we have...we're losing more and more of that 42 percent who are paying most of the taxes to South Dakota, to the Dakota dunes. A lot of the people are moving over there and many of them still have their businesses in my...in our town. But they're moving over there because of the...there's no income tax. I know we can never reach that in Nebraska. As they call Nebraska the good life, well, it is the good life, but we have to keep it affordable. We have to have something here to attract people to come here. If we keep playing with our taxes, well, they're certainly not going to, they're not going to come here, and a lot of them that are here are not going to stay. And then a lot of people that are definitely for higher income taxes rather than other taxes are people who accumulate wealth over their lifetime. They accumulate wealth but they do not actually pay as much in the form of income tax on the way to accumulation. The rest of us, in our working careers we do pay taxes as we go along and hope at the end of our careers we have a little wealth to live on for the rest of our time here on this, God's good green earth. But...so it depends on where you're at whether you're for a bill or against a bill. I know we have a...I know, because I serve on Appropriations, I know the situation we're in, but I think what we're trying to do with broadening the sales tax base, that we should stick to that and if we have to broaden it a little further or whatever, because I think that is a much more fairer way to go. Because I don't think we need to drive more people out of our state. Another thing I do agree with, what Senator Raikes said. I think we should have, if we do anything like this, we should come up with a deduction, even if we don't, for long-term care insurance. I used to sell that and the thing is it's such an investment for the states. In fact, I back it at ALEC. We've been talking to the people in the Bush Administration about their thinking about that, making tax breaks on a national level for long-term care because people are living longer and longer and longer and that's what's eating up our budget, nursing home care. So I think it's a win-win situation over a period of time. But I don't think we have time to do that during the session. We've got four days left to get a budget passed. So, like I say, I don't know how many people we want to drive out of our state. I don't think we can afford to drive more people out of our state, and I don't think this is
