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FLOOR DEBATE

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LB 379

SENATOR SCHIMEK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...vehicles, and to others. Sometimes you'll say to one of these persons, if you would buy a new car it would be cheaper, and this person will say, if I could get enough money together at one time to make the down payment and make the other payments, I would. But all they can do is make enough money to pay these repairs; keep the car running long enough to make enough money to repair it when it breaks down again. So the people least able to afford it are the ones who will be taxed, and I cannot agree with that. So some of the things in that package that I haven't really sighted down on yet I certainly intend to deal with when we get over there. But remember, Senator Redfield, those ladies pay sales tax. SENATOR SCHIMEK: Eleven seconds.
