LB 574A, 759A, 759

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Raikes. You've heard the opening on LB 574A. Open for discussion on that motion. Senator Raikes, there are no lights on. He waives the opportunity to close. The question before the body is passage of LB 574A. All in favor of the motion vote aye, opposed nay. The motion before the body is advancement of LB 574A. Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 574A.

SENATOR CUDABACK: LB 574A does advance. (Visitors introduced.) Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next bill this morning, LB 759A, introduced by Senator Brashear. (Read title.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Brashear, you're recognized to open on advancement of LB 759A.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. LB 759A needs to, of course, trail along with LB 759. And once we had advanced LB 759, why, then we got the fiscal note indicating that we needed three-quarters of one revenue agent, and one full-time tax law conferee in order to fully implement the bill. The agency is indicating, and I think we can all understand it, that there's going to be a tracking down and searching out people who need to be licensed, and putting together rules and deciding what exactly what is to be taxed and not taxed under the language as written. And so that's the reason for the bill. And we're talking about \$62,000, in round numbers, in FY '03-04, and \$86,000 in FY '04-05. I would ask your support for and advancement of LB 759A. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Brashear. Open for discussion on the motion to advance LB 759A. Seeing no lights on, Senator Brashear. He waives the opportunity to close. The question before the body is, shall LB 759A advance? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.
