SENATOR CONNEALY: Thank you, Mr. President, members. Repair labor is tough, tough for the agricultural industry, tough for older vehicle...older things that people of modest means have, we tend to repair more if you don't have that much income. This is a tough...repair labor is a tough tax to take, but we need this chunk of revenue to fill the hole. This is part of what the revenue package is. We need to make sure that we have the options to make sure that we can fill the appropriations budget request. This is something we have to do, even though it tends to hit ag harder, it tends to hit repair of older products more. It tends to hit moderate income people more I think, but I am going to be in support of this bill.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Connealy. Senator Raikes, followed by Senator Bromm and six others.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you, Mr. President. Members of the Legislature, I'm going to support the Revenue Committee amendment again. I supported it in the committee and I continue to. But I'm going to take this opportunity, if I could, to ask Senator Landis a question or two about some of the provisions of the way this might operate. You mentioned, Senator Landis, ag...repairs on ag equipment. Now I want to make sure I understand that. If I have an agricultural machine and I am either...well, let's say first off I'm buying a part for that machine which I'm going to...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Raikes, I'm sorry to interrupt you, but we can't hardly hear you. Could you speak a little louder. We're afraid to adjust the volume because we may go blank again, so please speak a little louder. Thank you.

SENATOR RAIKES: Okay. Is that any better, or not?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Little better. Thank you.

SENATOR RAIKES: Worse. Back to fixing my machine, if I buy a part to put on that machine and do it myself, I'm going to pay tax on the part. So this is a taxable part. Okay? Now what
