Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: I'm going to call the question on the committee amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: We are on the committee amendment. Senator Landis, there are 12 lights and there's only...

SENATOR LANDIS: Senator Cudaback, not a single one of those speakers so far has mentioned the piece on energy to manufacturers that's being cut out by the committee amendment. In other words, I think there's been adequate debate, because nobody wants to talk about the piece that doesn't revolve around repair labor. We all want to talk about repair labor.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Point of order.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If the question is being called there can be no debate on it.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Correct. The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do see five hands. The question before the body is, shall debate cease on AM1710, offered by the Revenue Committee? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. The question before the body is, shall debate cease, Revenue Committee amendment AM1710? Have you all voted who care to? Have you all voted? Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 8 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Debate does not cease. Senator Beutler, followed by Senators Kremer, Redfield, Janssen, Jensen, Jones, Stuhr, Schrock, Landis.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Cudaback, members of the Legislature, I support keeping options open at this point, given the kind of two-track system that we're on. Is my microphone on?

SENATOR CUDABACK: It is on. You got to speak more directly
