Meantime, go back downtown that has held that community together for so many years. Between those people, the big corporations and the Internet, they've ruined downtown Nebraska. Those buildings are filled now with antique shops. I never knew there was so many antiques around as you can find in those. I don't know where they find them all. You could probably find a few at my house. We've got a lot of antiques, but we still use them. So these are the kind of things...I needed to vent this. I'm sorry I'm doing it on this bill. But I also want to bring up the fact that I do have a lot of repair in my business and I do pay a lot of money to that repairman, more than I probably should.
