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we tax repair labor and repair items? If we tax everything else, yes. If we're picking and choosing, I say no. We're in a situation where we're going to tax construction. Many states, they actually give you a tax deduction if you improve your property. We're going to tax it if you improve your property and, not only that, after it's improved then we will raise your property taxes because it's a better...it has a higher value now. There's something wrong with that too. So I hope that we can be a little cautious on where we're going. Am I going to support this bill?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR JENSEN: I don't know. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Jensen. (Visitors introduced.) On with discussion of AM1710 offered by the Revenue Committee. Senator Jones, followed by Senator Stuhr and others.

SENATOR JONES: Mr. President, members of the body, I rise in opposition to this whole bill. I realize that maybe we could try to get ag out of it, but I'm really concerned about going down this route. And it's so confusing now you can't believe the problems they're having trying to figure out what to tax and what not to tax, and then after the bill that was passed last year on services, I'm still having problems with it far as the cleaning and different things like that, little things that nobody even thought about before that's a big problem there. I can give you an example on farm sales right now, and I don't know why we can't get it figured out just how to handle it, but if you go to a farm sale and you have a set of duals laying on the ground and you buy them, you got sales tax on them. But if they was on that tractor, you put the whole thing on depreciation. And you go up to pay for something, they say, do you want to put it on sales tax or do you want to put it on depreciation, and half the time they'll say, well, I want to just get it over with; I want to put it on sales tax. And then you end up, it ends up on depreciation. Then you got to try to get a refund back. So it's so complicated I just don't understand how we can go this route here too. And you might
