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feel that way, and that the number of lights and the number of speakers is not a reflection of the concern, or of the people willing to vote in favor of this amendment. I think it is a fair issue, and I think it affects people disproportionately. and that's why I introduced it. But it also affects people proportionately, because it covers everybody, all repair labor on all automobiles, whatever the dollar amount of the repair or the dollar amount of the vehicle. Thank you. And thank you, Senator Landis, for the time.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Preister. Senator Chambers, followed by Senators Louden and Engel.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, is Senator Bourne in the Chamber?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bourne, are you available for a question? Yes, he is, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Bourne, you're a member of the Revenue Committee, and you may know this...the answer to this question, and you may not. Would you yield to a question?

SENATOR BOURNE: Yes.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bourne.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is bull semen exempted from sales tax?

SENATOR BOURNE: I think it is, under the current status of the law.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Would that be considered a dispensation for a certain segment of the population?

SENATOR BOURNE: Probably those who use bull semen.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Bourne. The reason I asked you, I'm not in a mood to be toyed with, and sometimes Senator Landis likes to get cutesy and say, well, I'm not going to answer that question. So I'm not going to ask him. And I'm
