Tuesday; if not that, Wednesday. That will be up to the Speaker. I just did some quick research. And it's unscientific, in terms of the fact that it's not staff-done, that I would take for granted. But I...of 53 agencies that have General Fund dollars in them, we've cut...32 of those agencies are operating on less money by the end of...by June 2005. June 2005, they will have less money in their budget at that period of time than we have at the end of this budget that we're just coming up, that we're just finishing. Less General Fund money, 32 out of the 54...53. Several of them, Status of Women and the State Fair and another one, have no General Fund money at all. There is no General Fund money in the Nebraska State Fair. There is going to be no General Fund money, if we continue through, with the Status of Women. Now, the other ones, there are 20 that have an increase in their agencies, and I will not go into the detail. I'm not going to pick those out and tell you, but I have them all here, and it is explainable about the reasons. But some of them have to do with lawsuits. Some of them have to do with additional...because we took so much cash fund...cash funds from them in the last two or three years of cuts, that we had to replace some of that money this year in General. So they are up through no fault of their own, you might say. Many other of them are up, like I said, because of lawsuits, which I would say is through no fault of their own. We have agreed as a body to be involved in water lawsuits and some other things. The other ones, that you well can imagine, are Health and Human Services, because those are areas that are growing, whether you like it or not. Department of Veterans' Affairs, for example, is up, whether you like it or not. Military is up, whether you like it or not. Board of Pardons, Revenue, some of those agencies, some of them have caveats in them. They're up now, even though they're not really up. It's because they started from a lower base. We had to replace some money because of previous cuts. So I'm just saying, please get active, if that's what you want to do, because we need to know. We need to know and have it debated as to where you want to make the cuts. If you're not going to support tax increases at all, and I know many of you are on record, either by a vote or in the paper, that you're not going to support tax increases, then I wish you would bring forward what cuts that you want to make, so that we can all debate them, win or lose. Win or lose, we have
