like...fine. Thank...I'd render the rest of my time to Senator Chambers.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Jensen. Senator Chambers, you've been rendered two minutes and 50 seconds.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Bromm. And I don't know if I like that word "rendered." (Laughter) But in the same way that some people can swill beer, I can swill time. And I'm going to take time on this bill; much time. But this is a serious amendment, not a symbolic one. And the amount of new revenue would be \$20,500,000. This is not going to break the liquor industry. It's not going to break any drinker. But I'll tell you what,...and Senator...some senators don't like this. I'll leave the senator nameless, but I think we might know who he is. Some senators don't like me to connect what's in one bill to another. But if you're not going to raise this money on the liquor industry, then I'm going to fight against any increase in the cigarette tax. And I'm going to take plenty of time on this one to demonstrate what I'll do on the other one. We had a bill earlier this morning, and I think some people, or at least on person, thought I was bluffing when I said I'd draw a line and I will take all the time that I need. Well, this is the bill. This bill is not needed by anybody. So it's a good one for demonstration purposes. But instead of just taking time and talking about nothing, I'm going to use some of it to discuss some of the problems in the society that come from substances, even though they are legal. Why would a substance that causes so much harm and misery in this society be legal? Because there is...

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...money behind it, and a lot of people want to do it. When an attempt is made to make totally illegal that which a lot of people want to do, the law making it illegal is unenforceable. An unenforceable law which remains on the books creates contempt for all of the laws, because that particular law is violated openly and notoriously by the lawbreakers, and those who are to enforce the law wink at the violation and look the other way. And that particular attitude toward the law
